

Apprenticeship Levels

There are a variety of available levels of apprenticeships. As to which would be appropriate depends on current skills and qualifications. Each apprenticeship will have an equivalent education level.

What levels are offered?

Level 2 (Intermediate)

This apprenticeship is the equivalent of 5 GCSE passes at A*– C or 9 – 4. An intermediate apprenticeship is a great level for those looking to get started in an industry through an entry level role.

Level 3 (Advanced)

This apprenticeship is the equivalent of 2 A level passes. However, many people who have completed their A levels previously may choose an advanced apprenticeship due to the opportunities and experience it offers them within a workplace.

Level 4,5,6 and 7 (Higher)

This apprenticeship is the equivalent of a Foundation degree and above. These apprenticeships would be suitable for those looking to progress from level 3 qualifications such as advanced apprenticeships.

Level 6 and 7 (Degree)

This apprenticeship is the equivalent of a bachelors or master's degree. These are usually offered through universities and other higher education providers with an employer. This is a great way to earn a degree while getting the experience from working within the desired industry. This also allows apprentices to earn a salary while studying as well as not incurring the costs associated with a degree.
